After a few weeks, a Sergeant noticed his leg wound and advised he see a doctor. The doctor did a preliminary exam and decided that he could not treat the wound there. Todd

One day while Todd was out running errands, he came home to fire trucks and flames, only to find out that an electrical issue in his apartment had caused a fire that left his house uninhabitable. Thankfully, his son lived nearby, so he was able to stay with him until he found another apartment. He had lost everything and needed to refurnish everything in his home. Through the Veterans Administration, he was able to find another apartment and he was referred to Sharing Connections. Once Todd arrived at Sharing Connections, we were able to provide him with a brand-new bed, a sofa, recliner along with all of the other essentials he needed for his home such as dishes, towels, personal care items and cleaning supplies. At Sharing Connections, we are proud to work with veterans, and partner with multiple agencies that are focused on veterans.
